## *Call for contributions*

*Innovating in safety. Which new ideas for tomorrow?*

Obtaining significant progress in industrial safety will undoubtedly require reinventing elements of current thinking and practice. The *International Forum on Industrial Safety* (IFIS) aims to allow the expression of these new ideas, which may tomorrow become the foundation of common wisdom. Alongside presentations by invited speakers, we have created a *fast-track* to allow participants to present their ideas, questions, methods, techniques, *etc.* The aim is not to present finalized results, but rather to provide a sounding-board for novel ideas which will allow a change in viewpoint concerning industrial safety. Proposals are invited from academia, as well as from other stakeholders (NGOs, government officials, industry) who often have fewer outlets for their innovative ideas.

Proposals for “lightning talks” should be addressed **before Tuesday June 15<sup>th</sup>** evening by email to [gilles.motet@icsi-eu.org](mailto:gilles.motet@icsi-eu.org), as a half-page text in French or English describing the question to be raised or the new idea. Authors will receive a response on Thursday June 17<sup>th</sup> evening.

In order to encourage this type of participation, registration in the Forum will be free of charge for authors selected for a lightning talk. Furthermore, a document in the *Cahiers de la Sécurité Industrielle* collection, presenting all the ideas, will be published with the authors’ assistance.

Proposals selected for presentation will have a 10 minute slot to present in English or French (“lightning talk” format). A debate period will then allow interaction with IFIS participants concerning the novel ideas. The complete IFIS programme and registration details are available at
